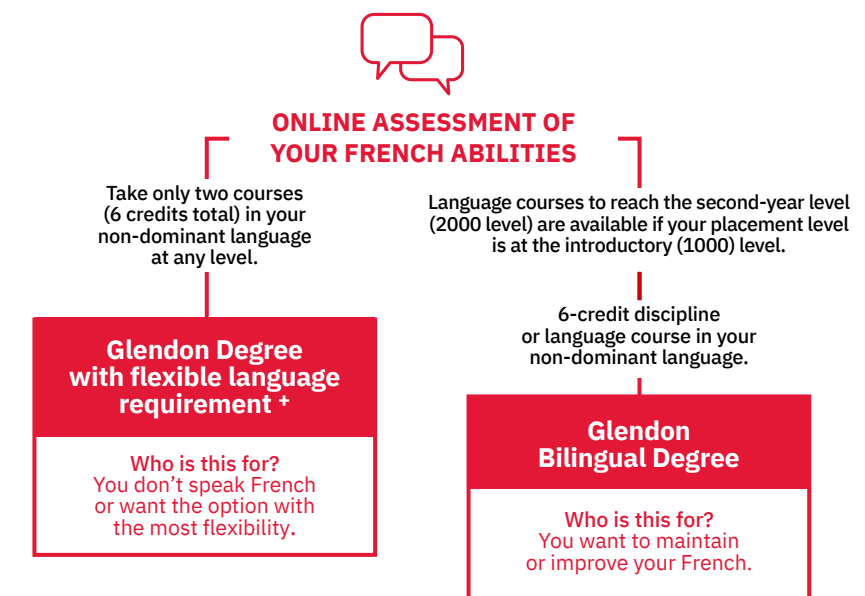

Choose Your Path

The degree that is best for you depends on your comfort level and an assessment of your current knowledge of the language.

- + If English is your dominant language, these programs are flexible: Business Economics, Economics, English, Spanish and Latin American Cultures and Societies, History, International Studies, Philosophy, Psychology, (BA only) and Sociology.
- + If French is your dominant language: Political Science.

Here is how you can stay on track with your admission to Glendon and remain connected.

From September to December 2024

Take part in our Fall Campus Day on November 9, where you'll have the chance to speak with our professors and learn about the services we offer.

From January to April 2025

January 15, 2025: This is the deadline for submitting applications for the fall 2025 session for all Ontario high school students.

Supplementary Documentation: If you applied to a program that requires additional assessment (BEd in Concurrent Education and iBA/BBA dual degree in Business Administration and International Studies), make sure to submit your supplementary documentation.

Scholarships and Bursaries Application: You don't have to wait to receive an offer of admission to complete this application. Submit it early to be considered for as many awards as possible (from both Glendon and York)—some deadlines are as early as mid-February, while the MyFile application **closes on April 1st**.

Spring Events: Join us for our spring events to experience Glendon and discover what it's like to be a student here.

Take a moment to celebrate, but don't forget these important next steps:

June 2025

June 1, 2025: Deadline for Ontario high school students to accept their offer. As soon as you accept, book your enrollment appointment on MyFile.

Enrollment Access Time: Your course enrollment access time will be emailed to you.

Residence Application: Apply for residence by **June 1** if applicable. Your room will be assigned in **mid-July**.

OSAP Application: Apply for OSAP by **June 30** to ensure your funds are available in early September.

Summer Courses: Notify the Office of Admissions if you are enrolling in summer courses.

Final Transcript: Your final transcript is required in August.

July – August 2025

Preparation: Get ready for classes and orientation! Important dates for the 2025–2026 school year will be posted online in the summer of 2025.

Budgeting: Budget for the year ahead. Consider applying for a job on campus through the work-study program or look into applying for a bursary.

Late August 2025

Glendon Orientation Week: Make new friends and get acclimated! You'll have the support of YU START student leaders and GL Zone peer mentors to help you transition to Glendon.

Early September 2025

Prepare to start your exciting journey at Glendon!
